

On Sunday August 10th 2008, Cayenne owners and drivers are able to attend a "Cayenne-only" off-road driver training course conducted by 4WD Off Road Driver Training at the Australian Automotive Research Centre in Anglesea.

This is a must-do for all Cayenne owners whether you intend to travel off-road or not and is highly recommended. This type of knowledge and experience is invaluable and will provide you with greater confidence about the way the Cayenne works and how it should be driven safely in controlled off-road conditions.

This full day course comprises a brief theory session to give you an increased understanding of how your Cayenne operates as well as practical sessions to get familiar with your Cayenne's capabilities in actual off-road situations. The practical sessions typically include ascending, descending and both rock and water crossing (pending rain), long, steep 60% slopes to allow you to master the emergency stall technique and finalize driver preparation before heading to the off road trails which provide challenging terrain to implement driving techniques. Specialist advice is always available from the instructor.

Please note this course is not designed to damage your vehicle. The majority of tracks have been weather proofed so the same course can be conducted in all weather conditions and each of the tracks is very wide, minimizing any potential threat of vehicle damage.

The day of instruction includes two (2) drivers per vehicle; just bring your own lunch and a spirit of adventure.

Getting there...choose from the routes below and follow the map.

Route 1 (From Geelong)


Along Princes Highway, west towards Colac. Continue on Highway 7.7km past Waurn Ponds junction, turn left into Cape Otway Road. Travel Cape Otway Road for 20km, through the township of Moriac. Turn left into Wensleydale Station Road (adjacent to Wurdi Boluc Reservoir) and travel 6.7km. Turn left into Gum Flat Road (gravel surface). The Anglesea Complex is 4.5km along Gum Flat Road.

Route 2 (From Geelong)

Along Princes Highway, west towards Colac. Turn left at Waurn Ponds junction, towards
Anglesea. Turn right at Forest Road, approx 32km from Geelong. Gum Flat Road is the first sealed road on left, 5.5km fro Ocean Road/Forest Road junction, and has road name carved into normal guide post. The Anglesea Complex is in Gum Flat Road, 9.2km from Forest Road. The major part of Gum Flat Road is a gravel surfaced road.

Route 3 (From Anglesea)

Great Ocean Road towards Geelong. Turn left at Forest Road, 3.5km from Anglesea, then follow Route 2.

Brief Course Outline

9.30am - Fundamentals Session

How does the 4WD work? This session is in a classroom type environment utilizing illustrative boards and sectioned mechanical components to illustrate "where the drive goes". Specific emphasis on the Cayenne's with practical vehicle demonstrations.

10:45am - Drive Session

Location – 80 hectare purpose built area encompassing moderate ascent/descents, steep ascents/descents, both rock & water crossings, side angles. Short bush trails drive prior to lunch.

12.20pm - LUNCH (BYO)

1.15pm - Emergency Stall Technique

This takes place on the gradients – 60% slopes with differing terrain (sand, gravel, dirt, clay). How to back down a steep slope in a safe controlled manner after a failed ascent attempt.

1.45pm - Drive Session

Trail drive through the 2,500 acre property. Some of the more challenging trails have been weatherproofed so we can use them rain, hail or shine. We will stop every 4-5 minutes to "read the terrain" or change drivers (2 per car). Trails are wide ensuring no vehicle damage or scratching.

3.30pm - Vehicle Recovery & Recovery Gear

Snatch straps, shackles, hand winching demonstration, tyre chain fitment both snow and off road, compressors, etc.

4.30pm (approx)

Course wrap & close.

Participants to make their own way home.
